Do you know the difference between premium ice cream, ice vanilla, frozen yogurt, sherbet, gelato, and Italian ices? A luncheon guest speaker will explain the differences and hopefully address your confusion. Just the ticket for a warm, summer day!

THE DISCERNING GROCERY SHOPPER

Special visits to the very best meat, seafood, and produce markets in the Denver metro area. At each stop, an informative talk by the owner : If its meats, a straightforward talk of the differences between U.S. Choice vs. U.S. Prime ; Imported meats-safe?, the important differences of dry-aging vs. wet aging of beef and its effect on both texture and flavor; which is preferable?; the attributes of organic meats-worth it?, hints on which cuts of meat to purchase if you want a great pot roast, when to purchase ground chuck vs ground round vs ground sirloin, the differences in purchasing meat in a grocery store vs a meat market, etc; can lean meat save you money? Which is a better buy-a boneless roast with little visible fat or a cheaper bone-in cut of meat? Which meat market has the best steaks? Ground beef? Baby-back ribs? Americans gobble up an average of 66 pounds of chicken and 110 pounds of beef, pork, lamb, and veal per person annually. Learn the secrets of purchasing chicken, i.e.: it is less expensive to purchase a whole chicken than buy the parts.

There will be plenty of time for your questions. Luncheon included.

Seafood: What to look for in purchasing fresh fish. Comparisons of farm raised vs. fresh water and ocean caught fish; Shrimp from the Far East vs. Mexico-to be avoided?; The misnaming of fish: for example, stores commonly advertise Dover Sole—and what you most often get is Lemon Sole, not the costly, flat, imported gourmet fish available only at a limited number of fine restaurants. Who has the freshest seafood? How to tell when fish are fresh and when not to buy. Learn whether the clear eye test is reliable in selecting fish? The most important lesson to learn is smell-fresh fish should have virtually no odor. A visit to a seafood wholesaler provides an interesting insight into restaurant selection of seafood.

Produce: How often have you experienced getting home from the grocery store only to discover mold spreading on your strawberries or peaches one day after purchase? Do you have lousy luck picking out canto lope or watermelon? How does one pick out a good melon? Why the ole thump test is not fool proof, proper home storage of produce, explanation of more unusual produce, safety concerns of imported produce.

Be prepared to visit several of the most unusual shops in Denver. We continually search the Denver metro area for unique, small retailers, that while worthy of your patronage, you have doubtfully ever visited, as most do not advertise, and many are completely off the beaten path.
